Summer time is a wonderful time to connect with friends, learn new skills or enhance existing ones, and discover new passions.

At Camp Cannon, we specialize in weekly enrichment sessions focused on The Arts & Academics, College Prep, SciTech, and Sports for students from ages 3 to 18. Campers learn while having fun on our 65-acre campus which includes state-of-the-art classroom facilities and performing arts center, two gymnasiums, a dance studio, a strength and conditioning center, athletic fields, track, tennis courts, and wooded wetlands.

Programs

Camp Cannon programs are open to all private, public, and home-schooled children. Camp runs for seven weeks from June 5 through July 28 with the exception of the week of July 3. Most camp sessions are three hours in the morning or three hours in the afternoon. Programs start at \$180 per half-day session. There are also a few full-day sessions available, as well as before and after camp care. Early care is available from 7:30 or 8:00 until 9:00 a.m., and late care is available from 4:00 until 5:00 or 5:30 p.m., both for additional fees.

Campers who attend a morning session may stay with us during lunchtime from 12:00 until 1:00 p.m. for no additional cost, if indicated at the time of registration. Campers are supervised while they eat their lunches brought from home, and then allowed to play until they are picked up or until their afternoon session begins. This is designed to add a little flexibility to busy schedules.

The safety of your child is our number one concern while he or she is in our care. From drop-off to pick-up, you can be assured that your child is in a safe environment. All of our instructors must pass a background check and drug screen, and our facility is secured through a comprehensive security system. Additionally, a certified athletic trainer is on-site during camp sessions to address common needs such as medications and to handle any injuries that may occur.

Q. Where is Camp Cannon located?

A. Camp Cannon sessions are held at Cannon School, located at 5801 Poplar Tent Rd. in Concord, NC. Camps traveling off-site are mentioned in the description.

Q. How do I register for a camp?

A. Camp Cannon registration opens on **March 1, 2017**. Online registration is highly encouraged to secure camp spots and is available via link at www.CampCannon.com. For paper registrations, complete forms A and B and mail or drop off at the address below with a minimum of 50% deposit via check, money order, or cash (drop only). Credit cards are accepted for online registrations; payment by check must be received within 1 week of online registration.

Q. Why should I register early?

A. Each camp session has a minimum number of campers required to run the session. Additionally, each camp session has a maximum number of campers who can be accepted. The number varies for each session. Some popular camps fill very shortly after registration opens. Others may cancel when student counts are too low to continue to hold open.

Q. When are payments due?

A. An initial 50% deposit is due at the time of registration to secure your child's spot in a session. The remaining payment is due by May 12, 2017. Campers who have not paid in full are not permitted to attend camp sessions. Registrations after May 12, 2017 must be paid in full.

A. Registration fees (\$25) are non-refundable. Session deposits are fully refunded if the cancellation is made before May 1, 2017. On or after May 1, 2017, no refunds are offered. There are no exceptions.

Q. What if I want to change a session after registering?

A. Changes and transfers of registration are free of charge before May 1. On or after May 1, there is a \$10 per transaction charge on all transfers that are not a result of a camp cancellation.
